# Halfway mark reached in fundraising baby unit bid

A MAJOR fundraising appeal has hit the halfway mark in its £3 million bid to build a state of the art new baby unit at the Countess of Chester Hospital.

Fundraising bosses at the Liverpool Road hospital say they have been overwhelmed with the support of hundreds of families, businesses and individuals who have swelled the fund to the £1.5m halfway mark since its launch in 2012.

They are now calling for as much help as possible to reach the target

of £3m.
The planned new neonatal unit at the hospital on Liverpool Road will be more than double the size of the current unit, providing improved facilities and a more spacious environment for the babies being cared for, and their families. Hundreds of parents and

relatives of babies whose lives have been saved by the aid and care given by staff at the current neonatal unit have been instrumental in or organising and taking part in fundraising events to boost the

Parents have shared their personal stories through the Leader and sister title the Standard every week.
The many fundraising events

have so far included marathons, sky dives, driving challenges, coffee mornings, and sports events, meanwhile fundraisers are already looking



ahead to future events such as the Chester Duck Race.

The appeal has taken to so many hearts that parents and others who have not been affected, but can emphasise with those who have, have given to the appeal and organised fundraising events to show their support.

Fundraising manager Janet Ratcliffe has issued a heartfelt thanks to supporters and is now looking ahead to reaching

the appeal target. She said: "The Babygrow Appeal has touched so many and people have really taken it to their hearts and through their words of encouragement, generosity and kindness, have got us to the halfway mark in this important appeal.

"Even people who have not experienced having to have a child cared for within the unit have emphasised and supported and given generosity to the appeal. That is truly fantastic also. "It is fantastic we have

reached the halfway stage but now we are looking ahead to reaching our fundraising goal of £3m and are calling on people to get behind the appeal and continue to support the appeal, one we very much believe in and is

vitally important." Last year, the neonatal unit cared for about 450 babies, many of whom were very poorly, either in intensive care or on ventilators.

Some babies stay in the unit for just a few hours, for others it can be weeks or even months.

Understandably, this can be a very anxious time for parents, who are often are spending a lot of time in the unit.

Currently the restricted size of the unit means they cannot always be provided with the space and privacy they would
